## *The Adventures of Michael Washington* *Continues*

About the last place I wanted to be on this incredibly hot August day was the somewhat dilapidated quarters of the district court in Wilman Valley's old Town Hall. The Town Hall had been built in the late 19th century and, despite several makeovers through the years and a stately outward appearance, I knew from previous experience that many of its mechanical systems were a bit faulty. This meant it was quite often cold in the winter and the air conditioning fought a losing battle during the summer. My expectations of being greeted by cool air when I arrived were pretty low, so I appreciated the air conditioning in my car a little more than usual as I made the brief drive from church.

I had been asked to serve as a character witness for Sid Andrews, one of our high school kids from church, who had been caught on the wrong side of the law and now found himself having to answer to the formal charges. When I arrived, I saw a handful of familiar faces, primarily parents of Sid's friends, whom I had seen around town on various occasions. Sid's parents, much to my disappointment, were not present, but not because they didn't care or were irresponsible parents. Sid hadn't told them about the court date. I encouraged him to do so, but he couldn't muster the courage and, to maintain confidentiality, I hadn't told them either.

Scott Andrews teaches an excellent Sunday School class for our adult department at church and is a close friend, so it was difficult for me to wait for Sid to share this information with his mom and dad. Scott and Denise knew about Sid's encounter with the police. In fact, it was Scott who went to the police station when Sid was arrested and brought him home. Unfortunately, Sid and the police (who assumed Scott knew the details) failed to tell Scott about the court date and the charges. He thought that Sid was getting off with a warning and a hard earned lesson.

Sid was a fascinating kid and had become a refreshing curiosity in our church. Unlike his two sisters, Sid chose to identify with the alternative crowd at school. They dressed

differently, did crazy things with their hair and didn't particularly care what the cool kids thought about them. At one time, Sid was into some pretty negative stuff, but at the end of his junior year, after some intense and personal searching, he had given his life to Christ. This caused some dramatic changes in Sid and in many of his friends, as well, but he didn't change the way he dressed and he didn't stop hanging out with his old friends. This really confused the kids in the church youth group as well as the fellowship group at school and they were even more confused when they realized that Sid and I were good friends and that his mom and dad were excited about him no matter how he dressed or who he hanged out with. Lance used to be scared to death of Sid and was really surprised one day when Sid made a big deal of coming over to him in the school library and saying hello. From that point on, Lance and Sid were special friends, and Lance's ninth grade friends were in awe of him.

Sometimes, however, Sid had a rough time sorting things out as he tried to reach out to his friends and be obedient to Christ at the same time. That's what happened in mid-July when Sid was hanging out with a bunch of his buddies at Rami's Skate Shop. The shop was closed and it was such a hot night that none of the guys even felt like messing around with their skateboards. Then, one of the guys had a creative idea. He said, "Let's go over to Skytop Swim Club, climb the fence and take a swim!" It was an oppressively hot night, so everyone agreed enthusiastically, never considering the problem that the pool had closed an hour before, that none of them were members and that they could get into some big trouble....and, unbeknownst to most of the guys, two of their buddies had a six pack of beer that they were planning to enjoy.

They hopped on their skateboards and zipped through the dark to the neighborhood by the swim club and then quietly sneaked up the hill to the pool, whispering excitedly and helping each other climb the cyclone fence as quietly as possible. Once they started swimming, however, they were less careful about the noise and had no idea how much sound travels on a dark, muggy, summer night. They discovered later that a neighbor heard the splashes and was concerned

that someone might drown, so she called the police. Suddenly, the whole gang, feeling cooler and wetter, found themselves under the beam of several hot searchlights. The police actually handcuffed them and started putting them in two police cars when the real problem arose. They caught Rusty Hess trying to get rid of the six pack of beer. What started as a simple escapade had now turned into something more serious. The law required that all of the kids, whether they were actually drinking or not, be charged with illegal possession of an intoxicating beverage. This is the part that Sid never revealed to his mom and dad and this was the reason that I was sitting in a hot courtroom.

When Scott went to pick Sid up at the police station, he worked very hard to keep a serious and angry face. Scott and Denise had very good memories and both of them had done their share of climbing fences and going swimming when they were kids and, although they wanted Sid to know that he had done something wrong, they were prepared to be very forgiving. Even the patrolman who released Sid to his father commented that he was a good kid, but, in front of Sid, he kept a very stern demeanor. When they returned home, Sid, feeling very guilty and ashamed, asked his dad to do a bible study with him. It was an unusual request, and Scott was ready to go to sleep, but he and Denise grabbed their bibles and Scott read the account of the woman caught in adultery. When he came to the final line ("Go and sin no more"), he read, "Go and swim no more!" Sid was incredulous. "Does it really say that?" he asked. Then he saw his father's smile and they all had a good laugh and went to bed.

As the district justice entered the courtroom, however, no one was laughing. Sid was facing the possibility of a large fine and the suspension of his driver's license for six months because of the presence of alcohol. He was one scared teenager and he knew that somewhere along the line, he was going to have to tell his parents the rest of the story. The judge chose to address all the boys together instead of individually and he began by speaking very sternly about the seriousness of the charges. As it turned out, I never was required to testify as a character witness because the judge, at the end, was lenient

and allowed all of the boys to plead to a lesser charge of creating a public disturbance which would not appear on their permanent record. They did, however, have to pay a \$165 fine.

Sid walked down the hallway with me to the cashier's office and paid the fine in cash. He had a job at a local fast food restaurant and had been saving his money so that he could pay for two of his friends to join him at a Young Life camp during the third week of August. The boys' parents thought that Sid's parents had provided the scholarship money. Neither they nor the boys knew that Sid had secretly decided to pay their way and let them think that someone else had done it. He was going to have to work some heavy overtime during the next week to make sure he could pay the balance.

As we walked out of the courthouse, I offered to give Sid a ride to the restaurant and, on the way over, I encouraged him to tell his mom and dad the whole story. Sid had made a bad decision and would make a few more in his life, but he has a good heart that has been transformed by the love of Christ and God is using him to touch some very special people whom many would ignore because they haven't taken the time to get to know them. That's one of the reasons that I enjoy my friendship with Sid. He has so much to teach me!
